





What are vitamins, and how do they work?



Vitamins are organic compounds that people need in small quantities. Most vitamins need to come from food because the body either does not produce them or produces very little. Each organism has different vitamin requirements. For example, humans need to get vitamin C from their diets — while dogs can produce all the vitamin C that they need. For humans, vitamin D is not available in large enough quantities in food. The human body synthesizes the vitamin when exposed to sunlight and this is the best source of vitamin D.

Different vitamins play different roles in the body, and a person requires a different amount of each vitamin to stay healthy. This article ex-

plains what vitamins are, what they do, and which foods are good sources. Follow the links in blue below for more information about each vitamin.

What are vitamins? Vitamins are organic substances present in minute amounts in natural foodstuffs. Having too little of any particular vitamin may increase the risk of developing certain health issues. A vitamin is an organic compound, which means that it contains carbon. It is also an essential nutrient that the body may need to get from food.

There are currently 13 recognized vitamins. Fat-soluble and water-soluble vitamins

Vitamins are either soluble, or dissolvable, in fat or water. We describe both types below: Fat-soluble vitamins- Vitamins A, D, E, and K are fat-soluble. The body stores. Trusted Source fat-soluble vitamins in fatty tissue and the liver, and reserves of these vitamins can stay in the body for days and sometimes months. Dietary fats help the body absorb fatsoluble vitamins through the intestinal tract. Water-soluble vitamins- Water-soluble vitamins do not stay. Trusted Source in the body for long and cannot be stored. They leave the body via the urine. Because of this, people need a more regular supply of water-soluble vitamins than fat-soluble ones. Vitamin C and all the B vitamins are water soluble.

The 13 vitamins- Below, learn about each currently recognized vitamin:

Vitamin A- Chemical names: retinol, retinal, and "the four carotenoids," including beta carotene. It is fat-soluble, Function: It is essential for eye health. Deficiency: This may cause night blindness and keratomalacia, which causes the clear front layer of the eye to grow dry and cloudy. Good sources: These include liver, cod liver oil, carrots, broccoli, sweet potatoes, butter, kale, spinach, pumpkins, collard greens, some cheeses, eggs, apricots, cantaloupe melon, and milk.

Vitamin B1- Chemical name: thiamine. It is water-soluble. Function: It is essential for producing various enzymes that help break down blood sugar. Deficiency: This may cause beriberi and Wernicke-Korsakoff syndrome. Good sources: These include yeast, pork, cereal grains, sunflower seeds, brown rice, whole grain rye, asparagus, kale, cauliflower, potatoes, oranges, liver, and eggs.

Vitamin B2- Chemical name: riboflavin. It is water-soluble. Function: It is essential for the growth and development of body cells and helps metabolize food. Deficiency: Symptoms include inflammation of the lips and fissures in the mouth. Good sources: These include asparagus, bananas, persimmons, okra, chard, cottage cheese, milk, yogurt, meat, eggs, fish, and green beans.

Vitamin B3- Chemical names: niacin, niacinamide. It is water-soluble. Function: The body needs niacin for the cells to grow and work correctly. Deficiency: Low levels result in a health issue called pellagra, which causes diarrhea, skin changes, and intestinal upset.

Good sources: Examples include chicken, beef, tuna, salmon, milk, eggs, tomatoes, leafy vegetables, broccoli, carrots, nuts and seeds, tofu, and lentils.

Vitamin B5- Chemical name: pantothenic acid. It is water-soluble. Function: It is neces sary for producing energy and hormones. Deficiency: Symptoms include paresthesia, or "pins and needles." Good sources: These include meats, whole grains, broccoli, avocados, and yogurt.

Vitamin B6- Chemical names: pyridoxine, pyridoxamine, pyridoxal. It is water-soluble. Function: It is vital for the formation of red blood cells. Deficiency: Low levels may lead to anemia and peripheral neuropathy. Good sources: These include chickpeas, beef liver, bananas, squash, and nuts.

Vitamin B7- Chemical name: biotin. It is water-soluble. Function: It enables the body to metabolize proteins, fats, and carbohydrates. It also contributes to keratin, a structural protein in the skin, hair, and nails. Deficiency: Low levels may cause dermatitis or inflammation of the intestines. Good sources: These include egg yolk, liver, broccoli, spinach, and

Vitamin B9- Chemical names: folic acid, folinic acid. It is water-soluble. Functions: It is essential for making DNA and RNA. Deficiency: During pregnancy, this can affect the fetus's nervous system. Doctors recommend folic acid supplements before and during pregnancy. Good sources: These include leafy vegetables, peas, legumes, liver, some fortified grain products, and sunflower seeds. Also, several fruits have moderate amounts.

It is water-soluble. Function: It is essential for a healthy nervous system. Deficiency: Low levels may lead to neurological problems and some types of anemia. Good sources: Examples include fish, shellfish, meat, poultry, eggs, milk and other dairy products, fortified cereals, fortified soy products, and fortified nutritional yeast. Doctors may recommend that people with vegan diets take B12 supplements.

Vitamin C- Chemical name: ascorbic acid. It is water-soluble. Function: It contributes to collagen production, wound healing, and bone formation. It also strengthens blood vessels, supports the immune system, helps the body absorb iron, and acts as an antioxidant. Deficiency: This may result in scurvy, which causes bleeding gums, a loss of teeth, and poor tissue growth and wound healing. Good sources: These include fruit and vegetables, but cooking destroys vitamin C.

Vitamin D- Chemical names: ergocalciferol, cholecalciferol. It is fat-soluble. Function: It is necessary for the healthy mineralization of bone. Deficiency: This may cause rickets and osteomalacia, or softening of the bones. Good sources: Exposure to UVB rays from the sun or other sources causes the body to produce vitamin D. Fatty fish, eggs, beef liver, and mushrooms also contain the vitamin.

Vitamin E- Chemical names: tocopherol, tocotrienol. It is fat-soluble. Function: Its antioxidant activity helps prevent oxidative stress, an issue that increases the risk of widespread inflammation and various diseases.

Bharat Biotech: India launches its first nasal Covid vaccine



India launched the iNCOVACC vaccine on Republic Day India has approved its first nasal Covid vaccine. Made by Bharat Biotech, iNCOVACC is administered in the form of drops and stimulates an immune response in the tissues that line the nasal cavity. In September 2022, China had approved an inhaled Covid vaccine, administered in the form or a spray. Scientists say that nasal vaccines may offer added immunity in the lining of the nose and upper airways, where Covid typically en-

ters the body. Research teams in the UK and the US have also been investigating nasal spray vaccines. In November, India's drug regulator approved the use of iNCOVACC as a heterologous booster dose - a booster for people who had previously received two doses of Covishied or Covaxin, the two main Indian vaccines - in emergency situations among adults. In December, it was approved by the drug regulator as a primary vaccine and as a subsequent booster shot in adults. The vaccine will cost 800 rupees (\$10; £8) per dose in private hospitals and 325 rupees per dose in government hospitals and can be booked on the government's online platform. Two doses are to be taken 28 days apart.

Dentists warn of permanent damage from clear braces ordered online



One man said aligners weakened his front teeth, leaving him unable to bite into an apple. Smile Direct Club, the largest company selling clear aligners remotely, says they straighten teeth faster and cheaper than traditional braces. Its aligners have been successful for the majority of users, it says.

But some dentists and orthodontists believe customers of so-called remote dentistry are unaware of harm that can be caused by aligners if not fitted by a dentist in person. Jamie, a father from Glasgow, turned to Smile Direct Club (SDC) after being quoted £4,000-£6,000 for straightening his teeth. The US-based remote orthodontics company was offering clear aligners for about £1,800 without the need to see a dentist in person. According to SDC, its platform has improved access to oral care and "has enabled successful treatment for more than 1.8 million people". The "overwhelming majority" of users have had an "excellent experience".

Apple Watches Help Predict IBD Flares in Small Study



People with inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) may be able to get an early warning sign of an oncoming flare from their smartwatch, a new study suggests. For the study, researchers asked 125 people with one of two types of IBD — ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease — to complete daily surveys about their symptoms and wear an Apple Watch to measure their heart rate. Because some previous studies have linked increased heart rate variability to IBD flares, scientists wanted to see if the Watch could detect these changes and predict flares. On the basis of patient-reported symptoms,

heart rate variability detected by the Watch was higher when people were experiencing symptomatic flares and increased inflammation, according to preliminary study findings presented at the Crohn's and Colitis Congress 2023 in Denver. "Currently IBD flares can be difficult to predict and identify early," says the lead study author, Robert Hirten, MD, a gastroenterologist and an associate professor at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York City.

Speed up work on setting up of nine new medical colleges: Minister

Minister for Health and Finance T. Harish Rao instructed the authorities to speed up work on establishing nine new medical colleges in the State by completing the process of finalising tenders at the earliest. In a monthly review meeting held virtually from Aarogya Sri Healthcare Trust office on Saturday with the National Health Mission and Telangana State Medical Services & Infrastructure Development Corporation officials, he told them to ground works on the new medical colleges by finalising tenders early. He stated that Telangana has a set a record in the country when Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao inaugurated eight new government medical colleges last month.

He wanted the authorities to work with the same spirit so that classes start in the new medical colleges coming up at Karimnagar, Khammam, Kamareddy, Vikarabad, Jangaon, Nirmal, Bhupalapally, Sircilla and Asifabad from the next academic year. He told them to make all arrangements till the team of Medical Council of India arrives for in-



ब्रिटेन की कई यूनिवर्सिटीज ने चीन की कंपनियों के साथ टेक्नोलॉजी से संबंधित समझौते किए हैं। ब्रिटिश सरकार को अब लगने लगा है कि ये चीनी कंपनियां ब्रिटिश यूनिवर्सिटीज से रिसर्च से जुड़ी जानकारियां चोरी कर रही हैं। इनमें ज्यादातर वे कंपनियां भी हैं, जिन पर अफ्रीकी देशों में जासूसी के आरोप लग चुके हैं। कुछ कंपनियां जो बैन हो चुकी थीं, नए नामों

बड़ी चिंता इसलिए- दुनिया के टेक्नोलॉजी बाजार में 54 प्रतिशत हिस्सेदारी चीन की सिर्फ 3 कंपनियों की टेक्नोलॉजी डिवाइस को जासूसी के लिए इस्तेमाल करने के खुलासे ने पूरी दुनिया को चिंता में डाल दिया है। इसकी सबसे बड़ी वजह यह है कि चीन की सिर्फ 3 कंपनियां 'क्वेक्टेल' 'फाइबोकॉम' और 'चाइना मोबाइल' इलेक्ट्रॉनिक्स डिवाइस के ग्लोबल बाजार में 54 प्रतिशत हिस्सेदारी हासिल कर चुकी हैं। दुनिया में 10 बड़ी लैपटॉप कंपनियां इन्हीं तीन कंपनियों के पार्ट्स इस्तेमाल करती हैं। कनेक्टिविटी से जुड़े बिजनेस में इन तीन कंपनियों ने दुनिया के बाजार में 75 प्रतिशत हिस्सेदारी हासिल कर ली है।

अहम बात यह है कि तीनों ही कंपनियां चीनी सरकार के नियंत्रण में हैं। टेस्ला जैसी बड़ी कार कंपनियां कनेक्टिविटी के लिए इन्हीं तीन कंपनियों का नेटवर्क इस्तेमाल करती हैं।

लोग अपनी जिंदगी की खुशियों को कुर्बान करते रहे। अमेरिकी मूल के उनके साथी जब पार्टियां और घूमना-फिरना करते थे, ये एशियाई अपने परिवार का भविष्य संवारने पर केंद्रित रहे। लेकिन अब जब बच्चे अपने पैरों पर खड़े हो गए हैं और ये रिटायर, तो जिंदगी को नाच-गाकर जीने का आनंद ले रहे हैं। अमेरिका के बॉलरूम डांसिंग क्लासेस इनके आपस में मिलने-जुलने के सेंटर बन गए हैं। इसकी वजह से इनका अकेलापन दूर हो रहा है। परिवर्तन से बच्चे हैरत में हैं- अमेरिकी-एशियाई इन बुजुर्गों के बच्चे इस परिवर्तन से चर्कित हैं और खुश भी। ऐसे ही एक युवा कहते हैं- मेरे पिता ने फोन पर बताया कि मां और उन्होंने डांस क्लास जॉइन किया है तो मैं दंग रह गया। मैंने उन्हें शायद ही कभी डांस करते हुए देखा। मेरे पिता बहुत उत्साहित थे। उन्होंने कहा- मैं जल्दी थक जाता हूं, लेकिन तुम्हारी मां नहीं। मैं और बेहतर करने की कोशिश करुगा। ऑरेंज काउंटी में रह रहे मेरे मां-पिता ही नहीं, टेक्सास में रहने वाले मेरे चाचा-चाची भी बॉलरूम डांसिंग क्लास जाते हैं। हमारे माता-पिता की पीढ़ी भी बदल रही है। उनका आत्मविश्वास बढ़ा है। वे ज्यादा सहज हुए हैं और अब ये नहीं सोचते कि लोग क्या सोचेंगे। हमें अच्छा लगता है कि वे खुशी से अपनी जिंदगी जी रहे हैं। जब भी हम उनसे पूछते कि उन्होंने अपने लिए कुछ क्यों नहीं किया। तो वे कहते हमें आगे बढ़ते देखना ही उनके लिए सब कुछ है। अब हम लोगों के भी बच्चे हैं, तो हम माता-पिता के रूप में समझ सकते हैं कि उन्होंने बच्चों के लिए कितनी बड़ा त्याग किया।

ब्रिटेन में चीनी LED लाइट्स के जरिए पृथ्वी से मंगल तक 45 दिन में पहुंच सकेंगे:नासा की नई टेक्नोलॉजी का कमाल



दुनियाभर के कई देश दशकों से मंगल ग्रह पर इंसान को भेजनें की तैयारी कर रहे हैं। अमेरिकी स्पेस एजेंसी नासा के मुताबिक पृथ्वी से मंगल तक का सफर 7 महीने का होता है। मार्स पर अब तक गए सभी रॉकेट्स को लगभग इतना ही वक्त लगा है। हालांकि, अब एक नई टेक्नोलॉजी की मदद से यह सफर मात्र 45 दिन का रह जाएगा।

इस नई टेक्नोलॉजी का नाम 'न्यूक्लियर थर्मल एंड न्यूक्लियर इलेक्ट्रिक प्रॉपल्थन' है। सरल भाषा में समझें तो नांसा ह्यूमन मार्स मिशन के लिए एक ऐसा रॉकेट बनाने जा रहा है, जिसमें परमाणु ईंधन का इस्तेमाल किया जाएगा।

दो तकनीकों की मदद से बनेगा रॉकेट- रॉकेट बनाने के लिए दो तकनीकों का इस्तेमाल होगा। पहली– न्यूक्लियर थर्मल प्रॉपल्थन। इसमें न्यूक्लियर रिएक्टर होता है, जो लिक्विड हाइड्रोजन प्रॉपेलेंट को गर्म करता है। एक्सपर्ट्स के मुताबिक, ऐसा करने पर प्लाज्मा बनेगा। यह प्लाज्मा ही रॉकेट के नॉजल से निकाला जाएगा, जिससे रॉकेट को आगे

बढ़ने के लिए तेज गति मिलेगी। 1955 में अमेरिकी एयरफोर्स और एटॉमिक एनर्जी कमीशन ने ऐसा प्रॉपल्थन सिस्टम बनाने की कोशिश की थी।

दूसरी तकनीक का नाम है न्यूविलयर इलेक्ट्रिक प्रॉपल्थन। इसमें न्यूविलयर रिएक्टर आयन इंजन को इलेक्ट्रिसिटी देता है, जिंससे इलेक्ट्रोमैग्नेटिक फील्ड बनती है। यह फील्ड जेनॉन जैसी गैसों को रफ्तार देती है, जिससे रॉकेट को आगे बढ़ने की गति मिलती है। इस सिस्टम को बनाने की कोशिश भी 2003 और 2005 में की जा चुकी है।

दोगुनी होगी रॉकेट की परफॉर्मैंस- नई टेक्नोलॉजी के जरिए वैज्ञानिक रॉकेट की परफॉर्मैंस को तकरीबन दोगुना कर सकेंगे। रॉकेट बनाने का यह कॉन्सेप्ट फ्लोरिडा यूनिवर्सिटी में हाइपरसोनिक्स प्रोग्राम एरिया लींड प्रोफेसर रेयान गोसे ने दिया है। इसका पहला फेज डेवलप करने के लिए उनके साथ 13 और लोगों को रिसर्च में शामिल किया गया है। प्रोजेक्ट के लिए 12.5 हजार डॉलर यानी 10 लाख 18 हजार रुपए की शुरुआती रकम भी दे दी गई है।

चीन के कर्ज तले दबा श्रीलंका, महंगाई दर 57 प्रतिशत हुई



चीन के कर्ज में ड्बे श्रीलंका का संकट कम नहीं हो रहा है। महंगाई 57 प्रतिशत पर चल रही है। आर्थिक तंगी के चलते खाने-पीने की चीजों के साथ ही फ्यूल और मेडिसिन की खासी किल्लत है। इसके चलते श्रीलंका सुरक्षा से समझौता करने को मजबूर हो गया है। वह मौजूदा दो लाख जवानों के बल को एक तिहाई घटाएगा। वह करीब 1.35 लाख जवान ही रखेगा। इतना ही नहीं, 2030 तक वह जवानों का आंकड़ा कम कर 1 लाख तक सीमित

हालांकि, इस बारे में सरकार का कहना

है कि कटौती का कदम उठाकर वह तकनीकी और रणनीतिक रूप से मजबूत और संतुलित रक्षा बल तैयार कर रहा है। संकट से उबरने के उपायों के तहत श्रीलंका अपने सालाना बजट में भी 6 प्रतिशत की कटौती करेगा।

इस बीच, भारतीय विदेश मंत्री एस जयशंकर के दौरे से श्रीलंका को बड़ी राहत मिली है। उनके कोलंबो पहुंचने से श्रीलंका को इंटरनेशनल मॉनेटरी फंड (IMF)से कर्ज मिलने का रास्ता साफ हो गया। दूसरी ओर, श्रीलंकाई सरकार के सूत्रों का कहना है कि जयशंकर के पहुंचते ही चीन दबाव में आ गया। उसने भी श्रीलंका को राहत देने की दिशा में कदम बढ़ाया है।

50 दिन सूरज नहीं निकलता, फिर भी जिंदगियों में **उजाला:नॉर्वे में पारा -25 डिग्री तक जाता है**

करीब 4 साल पहले जब मैं नॉर्वे के इस ट्रोमसो शहर में आया था, तो लग रहा था कि जिंदगी कितनी मुश्किल होगी यहां। 50–50 दिन सूरज नहीं निकलता। पारा –25 डिग्री तक चला जाता है। बर्फ पर फिसलने से चोट लगना आम बात है।

अंधेरे में एक्सीडेंट बहुत होते हैं। चीजें बहुत महंगी हैं। ऐसी जगह कैसे रह पाऊंगा? मगर ये सिक्के का एक पहलू है। कई बार निगेटिविटीं में पॉजिटिविटी भी होती है। सिर्फ नजरिया बदलने की जरूरत है, नजारा खुद बदल जाता है। नॉर्व में LED लाइट्स से पूरी की जाती है सूरज की कमी– यह रिपोर्ट पढ़ने के बाद गारंटी है कि आपको भी ये तो जरूर लगने लगेगा कि काथ. मैं भी यहां जा पाता या फिर यहीं बस भी जाता। जैसा कि अब मुझे महसूस होता है। करीब 70 हजार की आबादी वाले इस शहर का दूसरा पहलू ये है कि यह चारों तरफ ऊंचे पर्वत से घिरा है। बीच में समंदर है। आसमान में ऑरोरा (कुदरती रंगीन लाइट्स) और दोनों किनारों पर बसी आबादी का नजारा देखते ही बनता है।

जिन 50 दिनों में यहां सूरज नहीं निकलता, उससे पहले लोग विटामिन डी, विटामिन सी और ओमेगा बी 12 के सप्लिमेंट्स जुटा लेते हैं, ताकि शरीर में जरूरी चीजों की कमी न हो। सभी लोग रोज घर में कुछ वक्त एलईडी लाइट्स को देखते हैं, ताकि शरीर में सूरज की रोशनी की कमी पूरी कर सकें। पेड़-पौधों के सामने भी यही लाइट्स लगाते हैं, ताकि वे जिंदा रह सकें। बर्फ पर न फिसलें, उसके लिए स्पाइक्स लगाते हैं। लोग जिंदादिली से जीते हैं– नॉर्वे में जब लोग बाहर निकलते हैं तो रेट्रो रिफलेक्टर पहनते हैं, जो बांह में लगता है। लाइट पड़ते ही चमकने लगता है, ताकि एक्सीडेंट न हों। सर्दी हो, गर्मी हो, बर्फबारी हो या बारिश– यहां स्कूल–कॉलेज और ऑफिस का वक्त नहीं बदलता। इनकी टाइमिंग सुबह 8 बजे से शाम करीब 4 बजे ही रहती है। लोग पूरी जिंदादिली से जीते हैं। पैसों के बारे में तो सोचते भी नहीं। बचत नहीं करते, क्योंकि इलाज-पढ़ाई का खर्च सरकार उठाती है। ड्राइवर और क्लीनर जैसा काम करने वाले भी हर महीने ढाई से तीन लाख रुपए कमा लेते हैं।
