

A reality check for BJP, a boost for the Opposition

The voters of India have once again asserted their collective voice! They have responded categorically to the promises and assurances made by the political players of different political hues. Major political parties and alliances have both positive takeaways as well as important lessons to reflect upon.

There are four important takeaways from this historic electoral verdict. Firstly, after two Lok Sabha polls in which the ruling party had enjoyed comfortable majorities, we are back to a Lok Sabha with no party securing a majority. The BJP has emerged as the single-largest party in the new Lok Sabha and its pre-poll alliance has secured a majority. The BJP has secured 80% of the seats within the NDA and is clearly the dominant player in that alliance. The I.N.D.I.A collection of parties is around 60 seats behind the NDA. Here, the Congress accounts for less than half the alliance, with the non-Congress parties in the alliance together having higher numbers than the Congress. The circle of numbers is complete with the 'others' shrinking to less than 20 seats. Thus, a mixed mandate from the voter in 2024, reflecting the diversity of opinions and preferences. Secondly, this election asserts a point that appeared to have been forgotten for long. This election result witnesses the resurfacing of an earlier phenomenon -'states as the centre of Indian politics'. Look at the five different results in the five states south of the Vindhyas - the BJP gets a majority of the seats in Karnataka, it shares an equal number with the Congress in Telangana, a three-party alliance sweeps Andhra Pradesh, the DMK-led alliances secured a majority of seats in Tamil Nadu and the Congress-led UDF has the upper hand in Kerala. In each of the five states, the verdict was dictated by distinctly state-level political factors. The national parties, the BJP and the Congress, had to dovetail their electoral strategies to the local realities.



The same trend holds good for a cluster of states in North India – Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand and Madhya Pradesh. A distinctly different electoral result in each of the four states is patently visible. This Lok Sabha election has once again placed the states of India at the centre of politics.



India's largest iron ore mining company, NMDC declared its FY24 results on Monday. Delivering unprecedented volumes, the company produced 45.02 million tonnes and sold 44.48 million tonnes of iron ore in FY24. Realizing a 10% growth in production and 16% growth in sales compared to FY23 volumes,NMDC is now the first mining company in India to cross the 45 MnT milestone in iron ore production.

The company's FY24 financial performance is in tune with its historic physical performance. NMDC reported a turnover of Rs. 21,294 crores against Rs.17,667 crores in CPLY, a 21% move upwards. Headlining the numbers was NMDC's Profit Before Tax (PBT) before exceptional item at Rs.8,294 crores in FY24, 30% growth over FY23's Rs.6,399 crores. The Navratna public sector company also declared 2 nd & amp; final dividend of Rs.1.50 per share to its shareholders in FY24, subject to the approval of shareholders in the ensuing AGM.

The Audited Financial Results for the year 2023-2024 were approved by the Board of Directors of the company under the Chairmanship of Shri Amitava Mukherjee, CMD (Additional Charge) NMDC in its meeting held on May 27, 2024. ONGC to set up 10 Compressed Bio-Gas Plants in collaboration with EverEnviro



Energy Maharatna, ONGC and EverEnviro Resource Management Pvt. Ltd., a leading developer of compressed biogas (RNG) in India have formed a joint venture (JV) to set up 10 Compressed Biogas (CBG) plants across India. The two firms have inked a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the same. These plants, being set up in the first phase, areexpected to reduce India's reliance on imported gas and boost domestic renewable energy production.

The 50:50JV between ONGC and EverEnviro aligns with the Government of India's initiatives, including the Global Bio-Fuels Alliance and the ambitious goal of achieving Net Zero carbon emissions by 2070. By harnessing diverse feedstocks such as agri waste, agroindustrial waste, energy crops, and municipal solid waste (MSW), the partnership aims to mitigate approximately 7.5 lakh tons of CO2 equivalent annually. HPCL Makes History with India's First Highly Efficient 'Solid Oxide Electrolyser'



Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd. has successfully commissioned India's first Solid Oxide based Electrolyser (SOE) at its HP Green R&D Centre, Bengaluru for Green Hydrogen (GH2) generation. This highly efficient pilot-scale electrolyzer can generate Green Hydrogen with 99.99% purity and marks a significant step in evaluating this technology for generation of green hydrogen and its derivatives.

The first of its kind SOE system produces Green Hydrogen from the electricity generated by a captive Solar+Wind plant using a 20 kW Solid Oxide Electrolyser stack. One of the unique features of the SOEC commissioned is that, it does not use rare earth materials for electrodes/ electrolytes. Further the energy consumption is about 20-30% lower than the other electrolyzer technologies. Going forward, this has the potential to enable Green Hydrogen Mission economically sustainable. During the commissioning, Shri S. Bharathan, Director – RefineriesHPCL, briefed the progress made by HP Green R&D to support HPCL's energy transition through innovation, research, indigenization, cost optimisation and revenue generation.

On the backbone of this SOE system, HP Green R&D Centre will carry out research in the areas of utilization of low quality steam/waste heat from refineries for hydrogen generation, carbon capture through co-electrolysis route producing syn-gas and e-fuels and the high temperature hydrogen for further downstream applications. With this, HP Green R&D Center has the unique distinction of commissioning all three leading technologies of electrolysers. This will enable, simultaneous use of different types of electrolysers to optimize the cost. This will also facilitate the study of the impact of intermittent nature of renewable energy from different sources and address various issues associated with it.

Too Much Sodium Can Make Atopic **Dermatitis Worse**



A new study in JAMA Dermatology_published today suggests a link between sodium intake and the risk of developing atopic dermatitis. The study also found that higher levels of sodium were linked to an increase in the severity of symptoms. In the study, which involved almost 216,000 people, the scientists analyzed sodium levels in urine at a single time point to estimate usual dietary sodium intake. Their analysis showed that people

with higher levels of estimated 24-hour sodium excretion were more likely to have atopic dermatitis. And higher levels were also linked to having more active and severe symptoms. It is a dermatological condition thought to be driven by inflammation. In high-income countries, it affects an estimated 20% of children and 10% of adults.

Despite its high prevalence, experts are still figuring out what influences the risk of developing eczema and what makes it worse. Although there are likely a wide range of factors, experts believe that diet plays a role.

Scientists have already investigated a number of dietary aspects, including maternal diet, omega-3 intake, and probiotics. However, many questions remain.

More sodium led to worse symptoms

The latest study used data from 215,832 people aged 37-73. Of these, 10,839 had an atopic dermatitis diagnosis. They estimated 24-hour urine sodium excretion from spot urine samples and used this to gauge participants' usual dietary sodium intake.

Their analysis showed that a 1-gram increase in estimated 24-hour sodium excretion was associated with an 11% increase in the odds of having atopic dermatitis.

It was also linked to a 16% increased odds of having active atopic dermatitis and an 11% increased odds of having more severe symptoms.

To validate this finding, the scientists also analyzed data from more than 13,000 participants in the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey. They showed that a 1-g per day increase in dietary sodium — estimated using diet questionnaires — was associated with a 22% higher chance of having atopic dermatitis.

Past links between eczema and dietary sodium

According to the authors of the new study, a German textbook published more than 100 years ago recommends a low-salt diet for people with atopic dermatitis. However, this recommendation had little data to back it up. More recently, scientists

have started to take more interest in the links between dietary sodium and eczema.

For instance, recent research shows that eating fast food more than three times each week is associated with worse eczema severity in children.

Although fast food certainly is high in added salt and sodium, other components of the

food, such as sugar, fat, or additives, may have influenced these outcomes. However, a small study_ from 2019 found that people with atopic dermatitis had higher sodium levels in affected parts of their skin compared to healthy skin. The same study showed that elevated sodium levels may influence the immune system, which suggests that sodium could play a part in the condition's severity.

Salt and the immune system

Katrina Abuabara, MD, associate professor of dermatology at the University of California, San Francisco, and one of the authors of the new study, explained to Healthline how sodium and salt intake can impact atopic dermatitis symptoms and the immune system overall. "It is hypothesized that sodium is stored in the skin to prevent water loss and may help

prevent infection. However, it can also activate cells in the immune system, triggering some inflammatory pathways and removing the 'brakes' from others," Abuabara said.

"One study has examined this process specifically in atopic dermatitis," she told us, "but more research is needed to understand the impact of sodium on atopic dermatitis and other autoimmune and inflammatory diseases.'

Abuabara said despite the findings, physicians are unlikely to suggest dietary changes just yet. "This study was the first step in that we were able to show an association between dietary salt and atopic dermatitis in a large population," she explained. However, she also told us that more research is needed before recommendations change.

"I think it is important to have experimental evidence that dietary salt can improve

Omega-3 Fish Oil Supplements May Help You Feel Less Angry and Irritable Omega-3 supplements can

more foods like fatty fish, extra virgin olive oil, and walnuts. If you rarely feel angry, irritable, or aggressive, then omega-3 could be a contributing factor.

New research has found that people who take omega-3 supplements like fish oil or who get enough omega-3 fatty acids from eating foods that contain them may be less prone to aggressive and violent outbursts. Researchers at the University of Pennsylvania found that commonplace omega-3 supplements reduced aggression by 30%, regardless of age or gender.

The meta-analysis of 29 randomized controlled trials showed that omega-3 reduced both reactive aggression, which is behavior in response to a provocation, and proactive aggression, which is planned.

How omega-3 affects the brain "The study's findings — indicating that omega-3 may reduce aggression and violent outbursts - align with existing knowledge about the critical role of these nutrients in brain health," says Stefanie Daniels,, a registered nutritional therapist who was not involved in the study. "While intriguing, it's not surprising given the link between omega-3s, inflammation reduction, and neurotransmitter function."

Daniels says these findings underscore the huge impact diet and nutrition can have on behavior and emotional regulation.

Omega-3 fatty acids are essential fats that our bodies need but cannot produce on their own, so we must get them from the diet.

They're crucial for various body functions, such as reducing inflammation, supporting brain health, and maintaining heart health. Daniels says they also help keep cell membranes flexible and are vital for brain development and function, influencing mood and behavior.

She points to four main reasons that omega-3s appear to have this effect on aggression. Firstly, they are anti-inflammatory.

"Chronic inflammation in the brain is linked to mood disorders and aggressive behavior, and omega-3s (particularly EPA and DHA) help reduce this inflammation," she explains.

"By decreasing inflammation, these fatty acids can support a more stable and balanced mood." Psychiatrist and nutritional therapist Dr. Jennifer Kraker, MD, concurs.

She says the anti-inflammatory properties of omega-3s are important for mood because when our immune system responses are elevated, they can trigger biochemicals that produce excess excitatory responses in the brain.

'This is neurotoxic for the brain and causes irritability and, in those susceptible to it, aggression," she explains. "Omega 3s work to inhibit this pathway." In addition, omega-3s enhance the production and function of neurotransmitters like serotonin and dopamine, both of which are crucial for regulating our mood.

Dysregulation of these neurotransmitters may lead aggression. However, adequate nutrition may help support these neurotransmitters. Omega-3s may also maintain the integrity and fluidity of these membranes, which Daniels says is essential for efficient communication between brain cells.

'This contributes to better emotional regulation and a decrease in aggressive behavior," she explains.

The fourth reason omega-3s may play a role in reducing aggression is related to HPA axis modulation.

However, Abuabara said that many American adults may benefit from eating less sodium for other health reasons.

"The average American eats more than the recommended amount of salt, and low-salt diets have been proven to reduce the risk of heart disease, especially among older adults, Abuabara said. How to reduce salt intake

With this in mind, we spoke with Lucy McCann, MD, a registered associate nutritionist and clinical academic researcher. She provided some tips on ways to reduce sodium intake in your diet. She recommends the following:

- When cooking, try to add flavor with herbs and spices rather than salt. Check food labels for their salt content. The Dietary Guidelines for America
- recommends eating no more than 2.3 g of sodium each day (5.75 g of salt).
- When you do enjoy salty foods, try to limit your portion size. Opt for low-salt versions of foods where possible.
- When buying tinned goods, choose ones in water rather than brine.
- As often as possible, choose whole foods like fruit and veg rather than salty snacks.

Overall, McCann, who was not involved in the study, told us that "for most people, home cooking is not the problem, rather, the salt in ultra-processed prepackaged fast foods is the primary reason for high dietary intake. Reducing your intake of these foods could make a real difference to your overall salt consumption.

"The hypothalamic-pituitary-adrenal (HPA) axis controls the body's response to stress, and omega-3s help modulate this axis, leading to a more balanced stress response and decreased tendency towards ag-gression," Daniels explains.


Other brain health benefits associated with omega-3 supplements Omega-3s may provide other brain health benefits in addition to reducing aggression. Daniels says thanks to their anti-inflammatory and neurotransmitter-modulating effects, they may reduce anxiety and depression. Additionally, omega-3s could protect against cognitive de-cline. "DHA helps maintain cognitive function and may reduce the risk of neurodegenerative diseases," Daniels explains.

They could also enhance neurodevelopment.

"In children, omega-3s support brain development and cognitive performance, potentially reducing ADHD symptoms," Daniels notes. How to increase your omega-3 intake

Now that you know omega-3s can enhance your mood and may reduce irritability, you might be wondering how to include more of them in your diet. First things first, it's a good idea to understand how much you need. Daniels says adults should aim for 0.6 - 3g of EPA and 0.15 - 2g/ day of DHA.

मालदीव में क्यों थे भारतीय सैनिक?

मालदीव में करीब 88 भारतीय सैनिक थे। ये दो हेलिकॉप्टर और एक एयरक्राफ्ट का ऑपरेशन संभालते थे। आमतौर पर इनका इस्तेमाल रेस्क्यू या सरकारी कामों में किया जाता है। मालदीव में इंडियन हेलिकॉप्टर और एयरक्राफ्ट मानवीय सहायता और मेडिकल इमरजेंसी में वहां के लोगों की मदद करते रहे थे।

भारत ने मालदीव को 2010 और 2013 में दो हेलिकॉप्टर और 2020 में एक छोटा विमान तोहफे के तौर पर दिया था। इस पर मालदीव में काफी हंगामा हुआ। मुइज्जू के नेतृत्व में विपक्ष ने तत्कालीन राष्ट्रपति सोलिह पर 'इंडिया फर्स्ट' नीति अपनाने का आरोप लगाया था।
